INTERNET ACCESS POLICY

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Due to the limited resources available for provision of public access to the Internet, the Library may set limits on the use of large files of still or moving images or sound, or on downloading files in any medium. Patrons utilizing the Internet for illegal or other non-legal research purposes may have their Internet privileges revoked.

1. Use per patron is restricted to two – forty-five minute sessions per day. Time blocks may be extended if not all of the Library's public computer workstations are in use.
2. If all of the Library's public computer workstations are in use, patrons must sign in on the Library Computer Waiting List Sign-In Sheet in order to reserve their turn to use one of the Library's public computer workstations.
3. Users must be at least 18 years of age or accompanied by an adult. Identification may be required. The adult is responsible for all material accessed by the minor.
4. Written instructions are provided for the use of the Internet. Library staff can provide minimal individual instruction, and limited research assistance. Library staff does not verify or interpret database information and cannot direct searches for you.
5. Please take appropriate precautions while transmitting personal or confidential information over the public computers and unsecured wireless connection. Please remember these are public computers and you are using them in a public space. Users should not have privacy expectations.
6. A printer is available for use at 20¢ per page. Print cards may be purchased at the Reference Desk. Information may also be downloaded to a personal storage device at no charge.
7. Public computers are provided solely for the purpose of legal research, to obtain government document information, or to use the Library's online catalog. All other non-legal related research, playing games, accessing chat rooms, newsgroups, entertainment, commercial business enterprise, etc., is not allowed.
8. Accessing e-mail is allowed only to send the results of Internet and CD-ROM research, or to access information for court, held in personal communication. Generalized internet searches or surfing is not permitted.
9. These rules are also applicable to users of the Library's Wi-Fi network. The Library maintains public and private Wi-Fi networks. Use of the private network is limited to qualified borrowers and staff.

Intentionally damaging or destroying equipment, software or data belonging to the Library or adding, altering, or deleting files on Library public computer workstations is a crime and all such activity will be reported to law enforcement. (See California Education Code section 19911).

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
